**NSPCC Assembly and Workout**

On Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> May, a visitor from the NSPCC will be coming to talk to the children about the work of the NSPCC in an assembly. The children will then be invited to help raise funds for the charity by taking part in a sponsored workout.

The workout will be in the form of a whole school 'Dance-athon' and will be held on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> May. We will send out a sponsorship form should you want to help raise funds for the charity. In addition to the assembly, our staff at Landscore will be discussing the NSPCC's Underwear Rule in our PSHE lessons.

During these discussions we will aim to teach our pupils important safety skills without giving explicit information or telling scary stories. We will be using the 'PANTS' acrostic, which is like a green cross code for staying safe from sexual abuse.

PANTS stands for:

- Privates are private
- Always remember your body belongs to you
- No means no
- Talk about secrets that upset you
- Speak up, someone can help

The lessons will introduce a range of ideas, all delivered in a way that's fully age-appropriate. If you have any questions about this work, please see your child's class teacher.
