

Sports Grant Funding 2016-17

The government has provided additional funding for the academic years 2013 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. Funding goes directly to schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and P.E. Landscape has received £9046. After evaluating our PE throughout the school, we targeted funding to:

- engage more pupils in sport
- to up-skill staff by working with other schools in our learning community
- to provide additional opportunities for all pupils, including gifted and talented
- to introduce additional extra-curricular activities to support the less active pupils and give them an experience of different sports.
